We lean on the generosity of corporate partners to help optimize these opportunities for our future leaders. Your investment will help shape the minds of the next generation.




THE DEPARTMENT OF ACADEMIC COMPETITIONS WILL SEND APPROXIMATELY 100 STUDENTS TO A NATIONAL CHESS TOURNAMENT IN WASHINGTON, D.C. IN APRIL 2023. HISTORICALLY, OUR SCHOOL TEAMS HAVE PLACED IN THE TOP TEN AT THE U.S. CHESS NATIONAL TOURNAMENTS.

IN ADDITION TO COMPETING IN THE TOURNAMENT, STUDENTS WILL BE EXPOSED TO CULTURAL EXPERIENCES, TOUR THE HISTORICAL COLLEGES OF THE CITY, AND PARTICIPATE IN A CHESS SCRIMMAGE WITH STUDENTS FROM THE BALTIMORE KIDS CHESS LEAGUE.

- CHESS TEACHES IMPULSE CONTROL AND ENCOURAGES RATIONAL THINKING
- CHESS PLAY IMPROVES STUDENTS' ACADEMIC, STRATEGIC, AND CRITICAL THINKING SKILLS
- COMPETING IN A TOURNAMENT IS MOTIVATIONAL AND INCREASES SELF-ESTEEM AND CONFIDENCE
- STUDENTS ACQUIRE ADDITIONAL CHESS SKILLS AND STRATEGIES FROM PEERS AND COACHES
- STUDENTS WILL COMPETE AGAINST 2,000 OTHER PLAYERS FROM ALL 50 STATES AND U.S. TERRITORIES
- STUDENTS WILL ENGAGE WITH CHESS MASTERS AND ATTEND WORKSHOPS OUTSIDE OF TOURNAMENT PLAY
- STUDENTS' POSITIVE EXPERIENCE WILL PROMPT THEM TO PROMOTE THE CHESS PROGRAM TO THEIR PEERS
- STUDENTS WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO EXPERIENCE NATIONAL SITES, CULTURAL EVENTS AND EXCURSIONS OUTSIDE OF THE TOURNAMENT.
