TOURNAMENT DETAILS

2024 National High School (K-12) Championship April 5-7, 2024

Playing Site: Baltimore Convention Center, Baltimore, MD

Hotel: Hilton Baltimore which is attached to the Convention Center

Depart: Thursday April 4 Return: Monday April 8

7 Round Swiss in 6 Sections: K-12 Championship, K-12 Under 1900, K-12 Under 1600, K-12 Under 1200, K-12 Under 800, & K-12 Unrated

Unrated players can only play in the Unrated or Championship sections

Tournament will use student's March rating

GROUP DETAILS

The Department of Academic Competitions anticipates sending 10 school teams (80 students in grades 7 through 12) to the US Chess High School National Tournament.

Each school will be allowed to send up to 8 students in grades 7-12 but must send a minimum of 6 students.

Each school must send 2 chaperones

WHAT IS COVERED

CPS Academic Competition will provide

- Round trip flight/busing
- Shared double bed hotel room (2 students per room)
- Single room for Chaperones
- Tournament entry fees
- US Chess Membership, if needed for the tournament
- Stipend for chess coaches acting as chaperones

Schools will need to cover

Cost of meals for their students and chaperones

Students may bring money for personal expenses like snacks, souvenirs, etc.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Selection of schools will be considered based on the following criteria:

- 1. Schools willing to cover the cost of meals for their students and chaperones
- 2. Priority will be given to schools that were not selected to attend in previous years
- 3. Active participation in the Academic Chess program over past several years
- 4. Ability to provide two level 1 chaperones for their team
- 5. Send a minimum of 6, maximum of 8 students in 7th 12th grade

INTEREST FORM

- Completed <u>forms</u> are due by Friday, Dec 1, 2023.
- Selected schools will be announced by Friday, Dec 8
- School Administrator will need to sign the form and agree to cover the cost of meals.
- List the school's point of contact name and email
- Include a tentative list of students

Selected schools will need to provide final list of students and chaperones in Mid to late January

EQUIPMENT/& FORMS

Schools are required to bring chess sets & digital clocks to the tournament; 1 per student

Arrangements will be made to send to the schools needed equipment & prior to the trip

All students will be required to complete a separate trip & media release form
